	M.S.D. Washington Township ("Corporation") proposes to issue bonds or enter into a lease to finance the 2017 Safety, Capacity, Efficiency, Technology, Renovation and Construction Project, which consists of updating, improving, and construction at various Corporation facilities, and which is estimated to cost not more than \$185,000,000 and is estimated to increase the property tax rate for debt service by a maximum of twenty-eight and twenty-eight thousandths cents (\$0.2828) per \$100 of assessed valuation.
2.	Under Indiana law, the voters in the area served by the Corporation will vote in a referendum to approve or deny borrowing for the project and raise property taxes to support it.
	Indiana law governs the format and wording of the ballot question for the referendum. Indiana Code 6-1.1-20-3.6(c).
4.	Under Indiana law, "the following question shall be submitted to the eligible voters at the election":
	"Shall (insert the name of the political subdivision) issue bonds or enter into a lease to finance (insert a brief description of the controlled project), which is estimated to cost not more than (insert the total cost of the project) and is estimated to increase the property tax rate for debt service by (insert increase in tax rate as determined by the department of local government finance)?"
Ind	iana Code 6-1.1-20-3.6(c) (emphasis added).

5. The ballot question then must contain three parts:

a brief description of the project;the estimated total project cost; and

- the estimated tax rate increase for the project.
- 6. The law requires the Department of Local Government Finance ("Department") to determine the estimate of the tax rate increase.
- 7. The law also requires the Department to either approve the ballot language or recommend that it be modified to ensure that the description of the controlled project is accurate and not biased.
- 8. On June 16, 2016, the Department received an e-mail from the Marion County Election Board containing the Corporation's proposed question.
- 9. The Board requested that the Department review this proposed question:

"Shall MSD of Washington Township issue bonds or enter into a lease to finance the 2017 Safety, Capacity, Efficiency, Technology, Renovation and Construction Project which consists of updating, improving and construction at North Central High School; J. Everett Light Career Center; Eastwood, Northview and Westlane Middle Schools; Hilltop Developmental Preschool; Allisonville, Crooked Creek, Fox Hill, Greenbriar, Nora, Spring Mill, John Strange and Harcourt Elementary Schools; and Wyandotte, which is estimated to cost not more than \$185,000,000 and is estimated to increase the property tax rate for debt service by a maximum of \$0.2828 per \$100 of assessed valuation?"

Determination of Tax Rate Increase

10. The Department estimates the tax rate increase in reliance on the Corporation's proposed debt from the project, assessed valuation of the property in the area served by the Corporation, an amortization schedule submitted by the Corporation, and estimated miscellaneous revenues of approximately 5%. Based on this information, the Department certifies a rate of \$0.2828 per \$100 of assessed valuation.

Accuracy and Bias

11. The Department must review the language of the public question to evaluate whether the description of the controlled project is accurate and is not biased against either a vote in favor of or a vote against the controlled project. The Department concludes that the description of the controlled project is not inaccurate and not biased against either a vote in favor of or a vote against the controlled project.

Final Determination

WHEREFORE, based on the above findings and applicable law, the Department finds that the proposed language is in compliance with 6-1.1-20-3.6(c) and approves the language as proposed. The Department certifies a rate of \$0.2828 per \$100 of assessed valuation.
