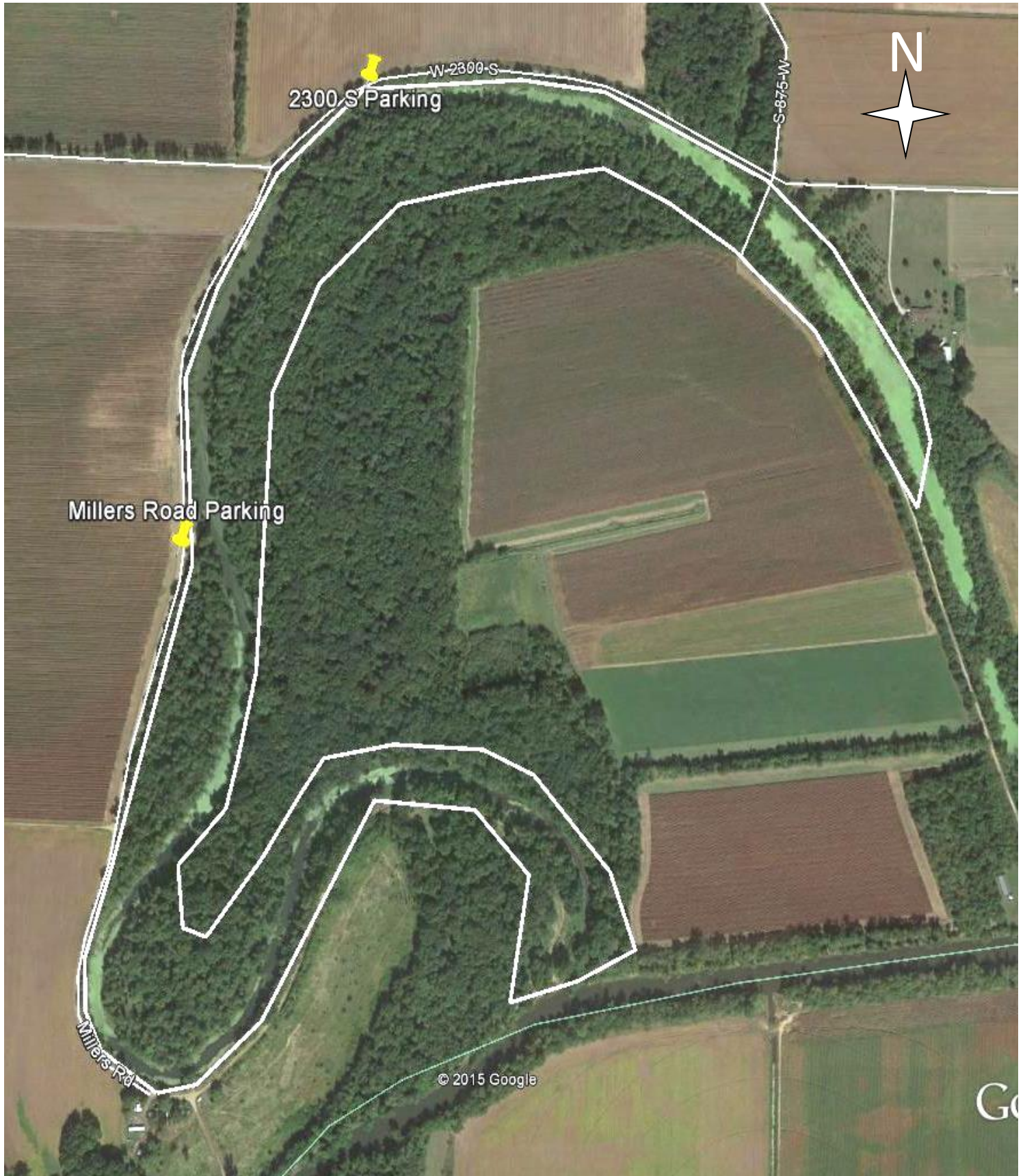


HORSE-SHOE BEND PUBLIC FISHING AREA



Horseshoe Bend Public Fishing Area
(Managed by Kankakee Fish & Wildlife Area)

Description: Horseshoe Bend is 10.7 acres of the old meander land along the Kankakee River. This old river oxbow is still connected to the river and serves as a water storage area during flooding.

Location: Horseshoe Bend is located just north of the Kankakee River and south of County Road 2300 South in LaPorte County. It is approximately 1 mile east of U.S. 421.

Parking: Parking is located along County Road 2300 South on the north border of the property and along Millers Road on the east border of the property.

Hunting Regulations: No hunting is allowed on the property.

Fishing Regulations: Fishing is allowed on the property subject to State regulations. No check-in is required.

Other Permitted Uses: Hiking, mushroom hunting, and wildlife viewing are also allowed. No check-in is required.

Restricted Uses: No open fires. No camping. No swimming. No horseback riding. No ATV's or snowmobiles.
No trapping allowed.
No hunting allowed.
