## Medical Nutrition Therapy Service Standard



November 2023

#### Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) Service Definition:

Medical Nutrition Therapy (MNT) includes:

- Nutrition assessment and screening
- Dietary/nutritional evaluation
- Food and/or nutritional supplements per medical provider's recommendation
- Nutrition education and/or counseling

These activities can be provided in individual and/or group settings and outside of HIV Outpatient/Ambulatory Health Services.

### Program Guidance:

- All activities performed under this service category must be pursuant to a medical provider's
  referral and based on a nutritional plan developed by the registered dietitian or other licensed
  nutrition professional.
- Activities not provided by a registered/licensed dietitian should be considered Psychosocial Support Services under the HRSA Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program (RWHAP).
- Provision of nutritional supplements not ordered by a physician or resulting from a registered dietitian's assessment should be considered Food Bank/Home Delivered Meals.

### **HIV Services Program Service Standards:**

Key service components and activities are noted in the Service Standards below.

f. Food preferences and cultural needs

 a. Client height and weight, ideal weight, pre-illness usual weight, weight trends, goal

b. Body mass index (BMI)c. Food allergies and/or intolerances

- 2. Assessment must be reviewed by a registered dietitian or other licensed nutrition professional.
- 3. A reassessment must be completed at least annually. Funded agencies should develop their own timeline for reassessments.

### **Service Delivery/Treatment**

- A nutrition care plan will be developed in collaboration with the client. At minimum, the plan will include:
  - Types of services to be provided (i.e., nutritional counseling, meals, food preparation education, etc.)
  - b. Frequency of services
  - c. Types and amounts of nutritional supplements (if applicable)
- 2. Plan will be signed by a registered dietitian or other licensed/credentialed nutrition professional, and the client.
- 3. The nutrition care plan will be reevaluated for progress or changing needs on an annual basis.
- 4. Sub-recipient shall adhere to all Federal, State, and Local food safety regulations (food handling, storage, etc.).

- 1. A completed nutritional plan in client record including indicated minimum requirements, signed by the registered dietitian or other licensed nutrition professional, and the client.
- 2. Documentation of re-evaluation of care plan annually.
- Policies and procedures addressing safety regulations and practices (if applicable).
- Services provided must be recorded in CAREWare service tracking system no later than 20 days after the end of each month in which services were provided.

#### Subservices:

- MNT Assessment or education
- MNT Prescribed home delivered meal
- MNT Nutritional supplements

#### **Service Unit Definition:**

- Assessment or education = 1 visit
- Prescribed meal unit = 1 meal (Meal unit=total number of meals being served)
