Condition Name:

Vancomycin-resistant
Staphylococcus aureus (VRSA) and
Vancomycin intermediate
Staphylococcus aureus (VISA)

Condition Name in NBS:

- VRSA
- *S. aureus*, vancomycin intermediate susc (VISA)

Reporting Timeframe:

Within One Working Day

TO REPORT:

- NBS users: Report conditions via Morbidity Report in **NBS**
- Non-NBS users: Report with **this** form

Associated Reportable Laboratory Results

- Vancomycin resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (VRSA) and Vancomycin intermediate *Staphylococcus aureus* (VISA) from any site

Condition Specific Reporting Details

- Clinical, Epidemiological, Lab Report, and Treatment information sections within the NBS Morbidity Report

Additional Documentation to Include

- Completed [VISA/VRSA Reporting Form](#)
- Culture and antimicrobial susceptibility results
- History and physical, most recent admission and discharge notes, any Infection disease doctor's note
