SPECIAL EQUIPMENT SUFFIX: Table listing codes for various equipment like no transponder, altitude encoding, etc.

AIRPORT SITE INFORMATION: Diagrams showing symbols for RIVER, STREAM OR DITCH, BODY OF WATER, UNDER CONSTRUCTION, and ASPH.

AIRPORT DIRECTORY LEGEND OF SYMBOLS: Table listing symbols for Relocated Threshold, Displaced Threshold, Closed Runway, Helipad, Segmented Circle, Windsock, Tetrahedron, and Wind Tee.

OBSTRUCTIONS: Diagrams showing symbols for Trees or Brush, Telephone Pole or Power Line, Road or Highway, Buildings, Railroad Tracks, Large Transmission Towers, ELEV. UPSLOPE FROM RWY, and ELEV. DOWNSLOPE FROM RWY.

NOTE: ESTABLISHMENT OF AVIATION FACILITY (i.e., airports, heliports, ultralight flightpaths, or seaplane bases) WITHOUT STATE CERTIFICATE OF SITE APPROVAL IS UNLAWFUL.

CRUISING ALTITUDES (MSL) FOR MAGNETIC COURSES: Diagram showing VFR Even thousands plus 500 feet and VFR Odd thousands plus 500 feet.

FAR 91.155 (a) BASIC VFR WEATHER MINIMUMS: Table with columns for Altitude, Flight Visibility, and Distance from Clouds.

ATCT LIGHT GUN SIGNALS: Table with columns for Color and Type, On the Ground, and In Flight.

ASOJAWOS PHONE NUMBERS: Table listing phone numbers for various locations like Anderson Muni, Angola, Auburn, etc.

RECOMMENDED COMMUNICATION PROCEDURES: Table with columns for Facility at Airport, Frequency Use, and Broadcast Position.

IFR RADIO FAILURE PROCEDURES: Table with columns for Route, Altitude, and other procedures.

RESTRICTED AREAS: Text explaining that Restricted Areas are designated areas within which the flight of aircraft, while not wholly prohibited, is subject to restrictions.

MILITARY OPERATING AREAS: Text explaining that MOA's are established for the purpose of separating military training activities from IFR traffic.
