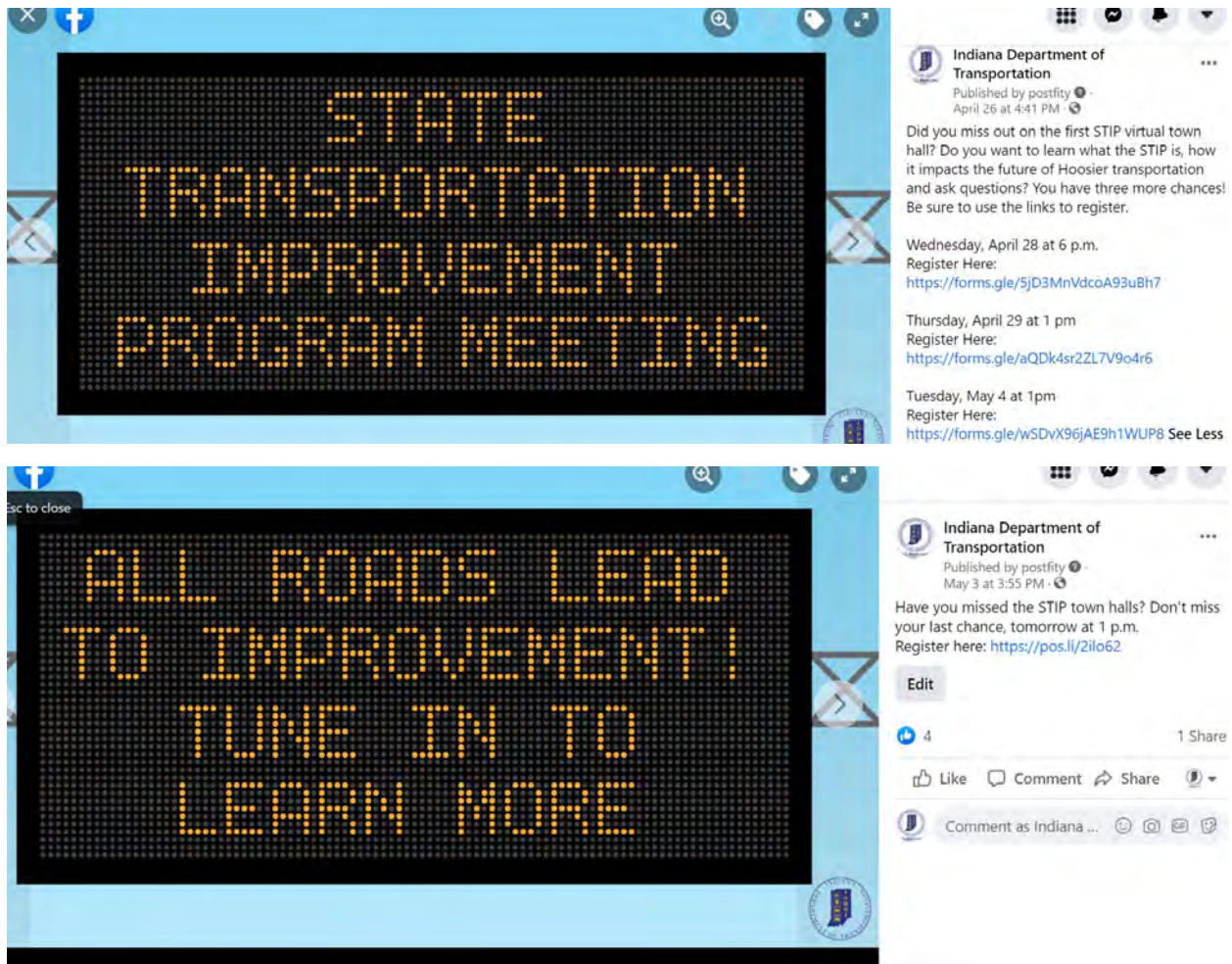

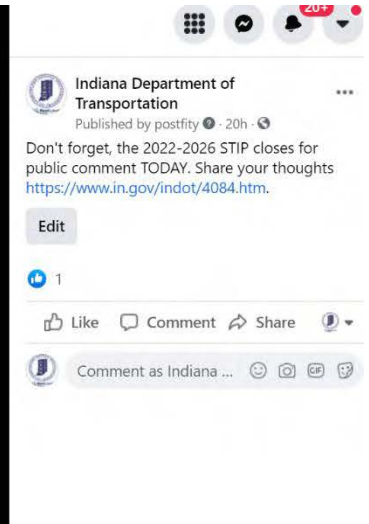
The first phase of STIP media release was in April 2021.

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) have made significant revision to the draft 2022-2026 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) document. As a result, INDOT will open a 15-day public comment period starting February 1, 2022.

The STIP is Indiana's federally required 5-year construction program that list all projects that are federally funded within the 5-years or state funded projects that are regionally significant.

Public input is critical for ensuring INDOT is carrying out the construction plan and our planning process in a manner that meets the public's needs. Our intent is to raise awareness to local communities and the traditionally underserved populations as well as provide access to information, comment opportunities, and virtual public meetings specific to the STIP.

Attached is a notification flyer that provides general information of the STIP. We would appreciate if it were distributed or posted at information centers or communication boards (if available). We have also distributed notification flyers to local public libraries if there's PC or Wi-Fi accessibility issues. In the flyer there's links to information or a QAR code can be scanned to access the INDOT STIP website that will have the latest information on the revised draft document, access to the document, access to virtual public events and event recordings, and public comment forms.

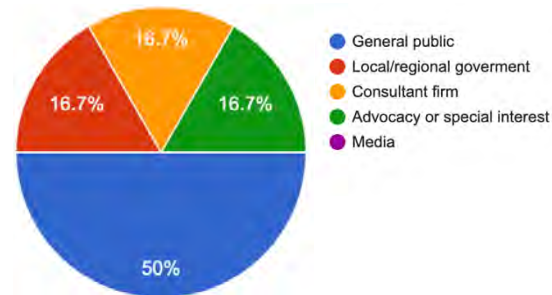
