10-DIGIT DIALING

If your phone number has a 317 area code, it's time to start including the area code when you dial local calls. A 6-month grace period will go until mid-September, when 10-digit dialing becomes mandatory. The new calling pattern will allow the new 463 area code to be added for new numbers this fall.

RATEPAYER SAVINGS

The OUCC & numerous additional parties have reached a settlement agreement with Duke Energy on the utility's proposed infrastructure plan. If approved by the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission, the agreement will provide nearly \$400 million in annual customer benefits. We have also negotiated settlement agreements in the Citizens water & sewer rate cases that will reduce the proposed increases by about \$35 million per year. The Citizens agreements, if approved, would also provide \$200,000 annually to assist lowincome consumers with their water & sewer bills. Money for the low-income assistance funds would not come from rates.
